### The Aspen Institute's Meryl Justin Chertoff



Meryl Chertoff is Director of [The Aspen Institute's](#) Justice and Society Program. From 2006-2009, Ms. Chertoff was Director of the Sandra Day O'Connor Project on the State of the Judiciary at Georgetown Law, studying and educating the public about federal and state courts. She is a magna cum laude graduate of Harvard-Radcliffe College and earned her J.D. from Harvard Law School. Ms. Chertoff is also a member of the O'Connor Judicial Selection Initiative Advisory Committee at the Institute for the Advancement of the American Legal System at the University of Denver; a member of the Washington Area Advisory Committee of Common Sense Media; and a Trustee of the Meridian International Center in Washington, DC.

Chertoff, who teaches about intergovernmental affairs at Georgetown Law, will discuss hot button issues in the relations between state and federal government, including health care reform and education. With state budgets in much worse shape today than even during the downturn in the 80's and 90's, federal money has become increasingly important to states with constitutional balanced budget requirements. Yet the strings that this money carries are unpalatable to governors of both parties, particularly newly-elected governors swept into office with promises of limited government. How will the tensions be resolved? What will the impact of federal health care reform litigation and the new re-examination of the Commerce Clause?
