### Kathleen Koch



Kathleen Koch is a Washington-based freelance journalist, author and speaker. Her best-selling book, *Rising from Katrina - How My Mississippi Hometown Lost It All and Found What Mattered*, traces her hometown's recovery from Hurricane Katrina and her experiences covering it. For 18 years, she was a CNN general assignment correspondent specializing in aviation reporting and serving as correspondent at the Pentagon, the White House and on Capitol Hill. Her two documentaries on Bay St. Louis's recovery received a New York Festivals Gold Medal. She also shared in the Peabody Award CNN won for its coverage of Hurricane Katrina.

Koch will talk about what happened at the real ground zero of Hurricane Katrina - Mississippi. She will discuss the area's recovery and the role the courts played in settling the wind versus water debate that for years prevented many residents from being compensated for the loss of their homes.
